

Oral History Interview

One: Ask a friend or relative to interview you

Find someone who has time to record a conversation with you.

Two: Write down the questions you want your friend to ask

Choose a topic you want your friend to ask you about, then fill out the **Interview Time** sheet before you start, or write everything down on a blank piece of paper.

Three: Ask for help recording your interview

Ask an adult or older friend for help using a phone, computer, or tablet to record your interview.

Four: Record a conversation!

Ask your friend or relative to ask you the questions you have written down. As you answer them, imagine that a kid 100 years from now is listening to you!

Five: Save your interview somewhere safe

Ask an adult to help you save the recording of your interview somewhere safe. Fill out the **After the Interview** page, and save it and the **Interview Time** page with the recording.

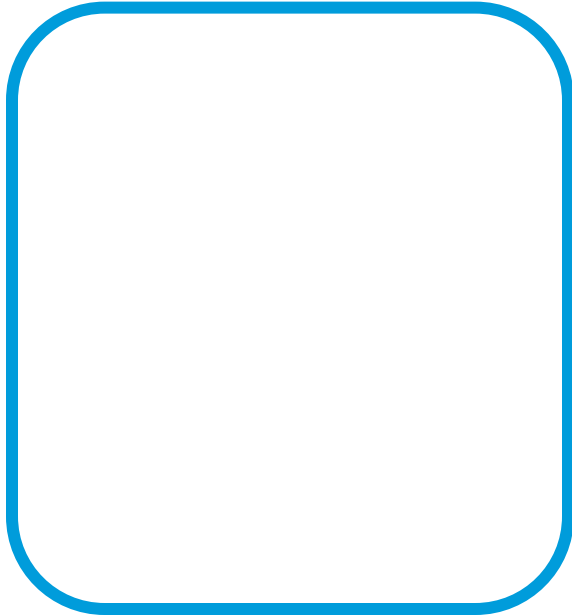

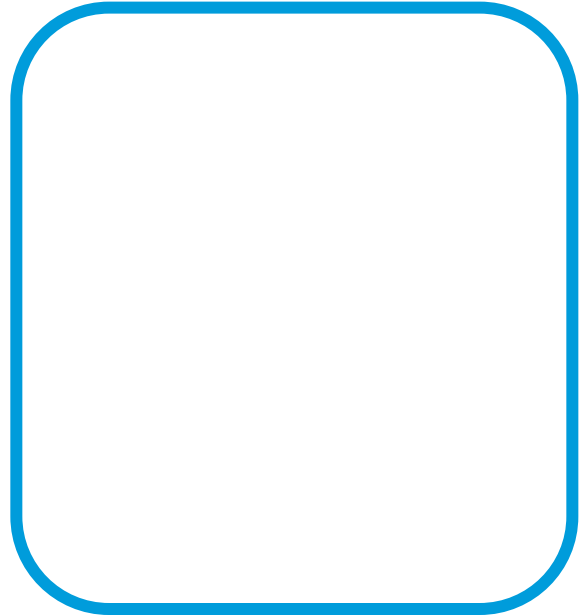
